CHANGES AT SOMPTING PARISH COUNCIL

What a summer we have had in terms of extremes: hot temperatures and torrential downpours. I hope by the time you read this, things are more settled!

There have been some significant changes. As many of you may know, I am now Chair of the Parish Council and have excellent



support from Councillor Caroline Baxter as Vice Chair.

We are trying to build a robust team of experienced and dedicated councillors in an attempt to build your trust and confidence.

Councillor Glynn-Davies is Chair of Amenities and Environment Committee Councillor Caroline Baxter is Chair of Harriet Johnson Centre Committee Councillor Mansfield is Chair of Planning Committee Councillor Nicklen is Chair of Finance and General Purposes Committee

I would also like to express how fortunate Sompting Parish Council is to have an excellent, hard working staff team: Carol Stephenson, Sue Tubb, Simone Williams and Leighton Clay

Sompting Parish Councillors have looked at their working practice and agreed a code of conduct:

- Respect each others views
- Maintain a non-political status for the Parish and Council work
- Respecting confidentiality
- Where there is disagreement: discuss and take a vote and accept the majority
- Not to speak over one another
- Not to stifle initiative
- All councilors to fully commit and participate towards carrying forward and actioning the agreed business plan
- To participate fully and communicate in community engagement
- To acknowledge and respond where appropriate to Clerk and councillor communications in a timely fashion
- A council representative represents the council as a whole, rather then acting in a personal capacity. This means that the representative must always act in accordance with council policies and procedures; the Members Code of Conduct and bear in mind the limitations of the council as a corporate body





The Sompting Festival raised nearly £900 and this will be divided equally between the RNLI and Help for Heroes. My thanks go to all those who helped to organise the event and to our sponsors who as always, were very generous in their support.

Earlier in the year you may recall the Sompting Parish Neighbourhood Plan went out for consultation and although much of the content within the plan was well developed, the Plan was not passed by an external and independent examiner. Unfortunately, this was mainly due to the time lapse between being written and submitted to an examiner for adoption. There have been many changes which need to be reflected in the SPNP and unfortunately there are elements which will need to be rewritten. There will be dates published when we consult on the new Neighbourhood Plan.

Councillor Glynn-Davies and her committee are working with partner agencies to consider solutions to prevent cars parking on pavements, causing adults and children to be vulnerable as they are forced to walk in the road.

Unfortunately the Public Toilets on Sompting recreation ground although well used, are frequently vandalised and this threatens this facility. The Bus Shelter in Western Road has also been vandalised and quotes are being sought to repair/replace.

I have recently met with Sergeant Peter Allan to discuss holding regular Police Surgeries and hope this will be taken forward in September.

The Air Raid Shelter is out of operation at the moment as restoration work needs to be carried out. We are working with Lancing and Sompting Pastfinders to apply for a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to help pay for the restoration work.





The Health and Wellbeing project based at the Harriet Johnson Centre, should commence later in the year and I will provide more information in the next publication of Signpost about this exciting project - so watch this space!

The Sompting Resident Survey is now available to view on our new website - hope you like the new style website and find it easier to access information you need.

TRAFFIC SURVEY



Following feedback from the 2017 Resident Survey conducted by Sompting Parish Council, it has become apparent that for all Sompting residents the problems of traffic congestion in Sompting has a major impact on their quality of life.

As residents are aware, in accordance with The Adur Local Plan, a development of around 500 homes has been approved in West Sompting, in addition to around 600 homes and a large retail development in New Monks Farm. In response to these concerns, it has recently been agreed at Full Council for a Traffic Count to take place. This will provide Sompting village with independent evidence of the current difficulties, and can be used to support requests for mitigation and transport solutions in the future. Sompting Parish Council recently responded to a consultation by WSCC on bus services. It has been agreed that sustainable public transport solutions would be an effective way to reduce the number of cars on the roads, and Sompting Parish Council are working to improve services and to restore Sunday bus services to North Sompting. Councillor Glynn-Davies Chair of Amenities and Environment Committee welcomes any suggestions from residents.

ANTI SOCIAL PARKING

Sompting Parish Council have welcomed feedback and suggestions from members of the public concerning the problems caused by illegal and anti-social parking. These include obvious issues such as parking round Sompting Village Primary School, but also on pavement and grass verges. Inconsiderate parking of this kind often renders roads unsafe by damaging grass verges, cutting visibility, and renders pathways unsafe by making it difficult for pushchairs, wheelchair users and those less able to use them safely.

In response to these concerns, Sompting Parish Council have been co-operating with Lancing Parish Council, Sussex Police and Adur District Council to develop a new way of working. In conjunction with Operation Crackdown it is now possible for members of the public to be supported to report dangerous, illegal and anti social parking in a safe and confidential manner. Councillor Baxter has produced an outline plan which the Parish Council hope to be able to pilot in the coming months. This will involve posting preventative reminders and involving residents in monitoring their roads and reporting incidents. Councillor Glynn-Davies, Chair of Amenities and the Environment, has met with Richard Cave, headteacher, Sompting Village Primary School to discuss school parking problems in Test Road, and meetings have also taken place with PCSO Ed Mitchell and Inspector Allan Lowe, Crime Prevention Sussex Police, Mike Thomas WSCC Highways and Geoff Patmore and Gloria Eveleigh from Lancing Parish Council

Any member of the public can use Operation Crackdown, whether to report anti-social parking or concerns with dangerous driving or safety issues. Reports can be backed up by photographic evidence but the public are urged not to put themselves at any risk in order to obtain this.
